Jul 20 2021 Do native speakers use present continuous when talking about timetables? Can I use *is coming* in my sentence? That film *comes is coming* to the local cinema next week

Do you want to see Jun 16 2023 The *ing* form in your example sentence is a present participle indicating something which is currently ongoing. So they have orders which currently *are coming from* all over the world

The *come* form would work too though it does not come with the implication that those orders are appearing now. It implies instead that generally orders do appear from all over the world. Similarly with the Jun 4 2016 I will *become* tomorrow

The act of coming here is taking a long time from the speaker writer's point of view. One example where this would apply is if by coming the speaker/writer means the entire process of planning packing lining up travel and actually traveling for a vacation

I will come tomorrow Further to Peter's comprehensive answer Do you come here often? completes the question in a continuous form as opposed to the more obviously present Are you coming? Do you come with me? is certainly archaic and if it was used today it would seem strange but at a guess it sounded comfortable for about 1 000 years until early Victorian dates Aug 19 2020 Coming vs

Firstly an end better describes the process or generality of something concluding rather than pointing to a specific singular conclusion Mar 16 2024 In that sense when you think about dropping someone off on your way home you would use coming and going based on whether the two of you are travelling to or from a place May 28 2019 The word coming can also be used in several other senses not all of which would have a parallel or related form using coming up I *coming up* could also be used when the destination is on a hill but that would be significantly less common
