One of the uses for this form is to politely suggest reluctance on the part of the asker

By using the past tense there is a nuance that they hope the wanting is in the past Jul 1 2021 If you would like for me to do something I find it much more polite to say Will you please? The speaker is being straightforward about what she wants and not trying to disguise it as if the question is about what I want May 15 2014 4 Which of the following is grammatical? If edited the question will be reviewed and might be reopened Aug 30 2014 The first is a direct question where the questioner doesn't know what answer to expect. The second is rhetorical i.e. it is the statement I know you want some drugs disguised as a question

Addition It just occurred to me that when spoken the meaning of both can depend on emphasis. For example these Do you want some drugs? and Do you not want some drugs? are both genuine questions Sep 24 2014 5 Both are fine options but if we're being pedantic they mean slightly different things
