4 the value is incremented 5 Repeat steps 2 4 This is the reason why there is no difference between `i++` and `++i` in the for loop which has been used Even though the performance difference is negligible and optimized out in many cases please take note that it's still good practice to use `++i` instead of `i++`

There's absolutely no reason not to and if your software ever passes through a toolchain that doesn't optimize it out your software will be more efficient
