JustSayNo was an advertising campaign prevalent during the 1980s and early 1990s as a part of the U.S

led war on drugs aiming to discourage children from engaging in illegal recreational drug use by offering various ways of sayingno May 31 2017 President Reagans wife Nancy Reagan launched the JustSayNo campaign which encouraged children to reject experimenting with or using drugs by simply saying the word no

The TheJustSayNocampaign focused heavily on street drugs and ignored prescription drug abuse which would become a significant social and health issue in the late twentieth and early twenty first century A little girl raised her hand she remembered and said Mrs

Reagan what do you do if somebody offers you drugs? And I said well youjustsayno. And there it was born

I think people thought we had an advertising agency over who dreamed that up not true Mar 6 2016 In what is perhaps Nancy Reagans most well known cultural contribution the First Lady stared gravely into the camera and told the American people to JustSayNo

Our job is never easy Sep 14 1986 Not long ago in Oakland California I was asked by a group of children what to do if they were offered drugs and I answered Justsayno

Soon after that those children in Oakland formed aJustSayNoclub and now there are over 10 000 such clubs all over the country Amidst the crisis First Lady Nancy Reagan stepped into the spotlight with a simple but memorable message JustSayNo

Her campaign became a rallying cry for many who wanted to shield the next generation from drugs yet it sparked mixed reactions as well Other articles whereJustSayNois discussed War on Drugs on Drugs with her JustSayNo campaign which was a privately funded effort to educate schoolchildren on the dangers of drug use JustSayNo is a widely promoted public health campaign initiated in the United States by former First Lady Nancy Reagan in the 1980s While JustSayNo supported a policy of abstinence the more liberal argument dubbed JustSay Know claimed that educating young people about the realities of drug use would allow them to make safer and more informed decisions if they were tempted to experiment.
