Unfortunately when I Google I m getting a bunch of low q Jul 19 2023 Idiomatically it is gentleman. Lady comes from an Old English compound noun meaning roughly loaf kneader whereas lord comes from a compound noun meaning loaf keeper or loaf protector

The etymological counterpart of gentleman which is indeed gentlewoman is used infrequently these days usually in historical or quasi historical contexts Jul 4 2017 How did lady and ladies come to differ in conveying degree of respect? Does calling to a strange woman Hey lady! sound angry? The takeaway from those is that you should generally avoid using the singular lady as a direct form of address to a person herself as it s likely to sound confrontational

There may be some exceptions Jun 2 2023 I tried searching Google Ngram Viewer for Look lady and Listen lady both capitalized so as to occur at the start of a sentence with the hope that these ngrams would reflect the usage of lady in a derogatory dismissive sense

It seems to have come into usage around 1950 and really took off in the late 1990s Most of the answers are missing the whole point of this question Gentleman
