It encompasses a range of diseases and conditions that include dental caries, Periodontal disease, Tooth loss, Oral cancer, Oral manifestations of HIV infection, Oro-dental trauma, Noma and birth defects such as cleft lip and palate.

The Global Burden of Disease Study 2017 estimated that oral diseases affect 3.5 million people in 2025. Oral health inequalities disproportionately affect the poor and socially disadvantaged members of society.

There is a very strong and consistent association between socioeconomic status, income, occupation, and educational level and the prevalence and severity of oral diseases. Nov 25, 2024. Delegations from over 110 countries are coming together to produce national roadmaps and negotiate a joint declaration on oral health at the first ever global oral health meeting organized by the World Health Organization (WHO).

The declaration is expected to outline collective commitments from Member States to accelerate the implementation of the Global action plan on oral health (2023-2030). Mar 20, 2025.
