The penny was one of the first coins made by the U.S. Mint after its establishment in 1792. The design on the first penny was of a woman with flowing hair symbolizing liberty. The coin was larger and made of pure copper while today's smaller coin is made of copper and zinc.

United States Treasurer Brandon Beach and Mint Acting Director Kristie McNally operated the presses to strike the final Philadelphia minted Omega coins in recognition of their historic significance. Circulating coins are produced by the United States Mint for everyday transactions.

They are also included in the United States Mint's annual coin sets which are the staple of coin collecting. The nickel, dime, and quarter are today's circulating denominations.

As of 2025, pennies are no longer produced for circulation but can be found in collectible sets. The penny, dime, quarter, half dollar, and dollar are clad coins. Clad coins have an inner core of metal surrounded by an outer layer of a different metal.

The Mint makes clad coins with an inner core of copper. The nickel is the only circulating coin that is not clad. The story of U.S. circulating coins began long before the opening of a national mint in 1792.

Before national coinage, a mix of foreign and domestic coins circulated both during the Colonial Period and in the years following the Revolutionary War. After Congress established the U.S. Mint in 1792, the Mint struggled for many years to produce enough coins.
